
MAY 2017 NEWSLETTER

New Dales Bus service:

Starting next month May 7th there will be a direct Dales Bus service from Preston and Lancaster to Richmond in Yorkshire running on summer Sundays and bank holidays. Part of this route featured as a recent slow TV programme last year.

This means that you could leave Preston at 8.15 (Lancaster 9.10) and be at Ribblehead station on the Settle & Carlisle line by 10.30. This might be useful on the two Sundays when the Dales Rail train is cancelled for track repairs this summer. Oldie bus passes aren't valid on this service but a
